Registration and breakfast from 8:00-8:30.





The General Meeting was held at the SureStay Hotel and called to order at 8:30 AM. The Pledge of Allegiance was led by Karen Laskowski (Gamma), and guests Dr. Lisa Cooper Wilkins and Delora Brown were introduced. Prior to beginning business, Parliamentarian Judy Silker (Nu) reminded members to speak clearly, identify themselves with name and chapter, and shared that the motion document should be completed during the meeting. Karen Laskowski reported attendance.

President, Pat Goeppinger (Gamma) recognized eighteen 50+ members and fourteen new members to DKG (pages 12-13).



#### **International Business**

President Pat Goeppinger read the DKG Visionary Network. Judy Silker (Nu) shared some of the interest group presentations she has attended including ones highlighting special education, Spanish, and Zentangle. She offered a virtual presentation on Sunday, April 27 on crochet.

"The Social Security Fairness Act, HR 82. The Windfall Elimination Provision and Government Pension Offset, was signed into law on January 5, 2025. Upon implementation, this Act eliminates the reduction of SS Benefits. Pat shared that she has contacted Social Security about the timeline. She was told it could be as late as November before some people receive their back benefits.

She also reported: The DKG Code of Ethics has been sent to all chapter presidents. It can be found, along with the Ethics Violation Complaint Form is available on the International Website.

A committee was developed to proof the minutes of the April 26, 2025 General Session. Volunteers included: Joyce King (Gamma), Susan Capistrant (Theta), and Donna Harper (Gamma).

**Finance:** The comprehensive financial report was shared by Maxine Emm (Delta) stating that some of the amounts presented are estimates due to not having all the receipts for convention.

**Nominating Committee** Linda Scribner (Lambda), Penny Thompson (Epsilon), and Susan Neal (Kappa). Penny Thompson (Epsilon) presented the slate of officers and asked for nominations from the floor. Hearing no nominations, the slate of officers was accepted unanimously.

**Speaker:** Homa Ekradi-Cohen (AKA: Emma)

Homa was born in Bandar Pahlavi, Iran in 1952 in the reign of Shah Pahlavi. She worked as a middle school teacher while attending college and then taught high school for 12 years, until the revolution of the Ayatollah Khomeini. She was jailed for her opinions as a teacher, persecuted, put in solitary confinement for 10 months, almost executed, and then served 4 years of probation having to check in monthly to the government, during this time. If it weren't for her family, community, and her students paying for the bribes, she would never be alive today. She emigrated to the U.S. in 1985 and became an American citizen in 1996. Emma is a member of Gamma Chapter. Her story shared the true accounts of life and education in her country of birth. Her presentation was entitled: Life and Education Under Two Regimes in Iran







<u>Alpha Chapter</u>: Awarded to *Arts for All Nevada Title I Program* to pay for *Artist in Residency* workshops & supplies (5 hours of art instruction at \$70 per hour) for the five Title I elementary schools in Reno (Kate Smith, Virginia Palmer, Agnes Risley, Robert Mitchell, & Bernice Matthews)

<u>Gamma Chapter</u>: Awarded to Lisa Lee, Cahlan Elementary librarian, for her *Lego Art Museum* project

<u>Delta Chap</u>ter: Awarded 11 \$250 grants to 1 elementary & 5 high school teachers in Douglas & 1 middle school & 4 elementary teachers in Carson. The high school projects included a fingerprint scanner for enhancing biometrics in the classroom, a mini portable PCR machine for molecular biology, 2 catapult/trebuchet/battering ram kits for bringing history to life, set design materials for Apple *ET* play & dinner theater, & creative writing materials for workshops & a *Write Night* performance venue. Elementary projects included *Santa's Story Squad* book deliveries to students' homes, hands-on learning math manipulatives, book sets to build stamina with independent reading, a math raffle reward program, & 2 GATE axolotl classroom pets with tanks.






